LOCKDOWN/INVACUATION PROCEDURES September 2022

Definitions:

Lockdown: Situations such as an intruder in the building, pupil or adult behaving in an aggressive way.

Invacuation: Situations such as a dog on the field, a chemical leak outside, intruder on the school grounds, pupil behaving aggressively, or the helicopter landing.

	Office/SLT ring over to nursery to alert. If incident in nursery, nursery staff to phone over to the school office/Headteacher if possible or use email to the office staff if not. Staff to lock all doors.	 VR- If in dinner hall, children to go into classrooms off the hall gym OR pupils go back to classrooms if possible. Year 4 to stay in the hall or library. At other times all pupils to return to their classrooms- or the nearest classroom if appropriate. (except Year 4 if in main building or nursery if in main building). Staff to make the decision on whether children need to hide under tables. 	
All clear signal	All staff and pupils to stay in their rooms/classrooms until they have been given the all clear. Office staff to go round each classroom/phone the mobiles and nursery. 		Pupils go through main playground to nursery or main entrance near the office depending on the situation, staff member on playground to direct. If need to move children from site, pupils will be led to the Orchard site or from Orchard to VR site. Walkie Talkies for Nursery.
Entrance and exit points	Staff near exit points/external doors, to ensure they are not on the latch.	Staff near exit points/external doors, to ensure they are not on the latch.
Bringing pupils inside	 At the sound of the hand bells, staff (lunchtime, Sports coaches, TAs, Teachers) will be responsible for bringing the children in off the playground/field as soon as possible. Staff will do a register once children are in the classroom. 	 Once a blue triangle is handed to staff (lunchtime, Sports coaches, TAs, Teachers) will be responsible for bringing the children in off the playground/field as soon as possible. Staff will do a register once children are in the classroom.
